A guide to holding a Virtual Christingle



This is a unique year for Christingle as for the first time ever many will take place online. But whether you're a virtual meeting expert or giving it a go for the first time, this guide will outline everything you need to know for holding a virtual Christingle celebration.



Using the right platform

Before you begin your planning, it's worth considering which platform is best for hosting your Virtual Christingle. There are many options, all with different strengths and weaknesses, so have a think about which is best for you and your community. Here are a few pros and cons for some of the main platforms we'd recommend:

Livestreaming your Christingle service

If you are able to gather for your Christingle service, you may wish to livestream it for those unable to attend in person.

Things to consider:

- Choose the platform on which to livestream (Facebook, Instagram, TikTok, Twitter, YouTube).
- Check you have a good phone or internet signal in your venue.
- Set up your phone/camera on a tripod or stand.
- Consider how you might get permissions for videoing participants or simply have the camera only trained on the leader.
- Ensure you have the correct licence for playing music as part of your service.

Online safety

When sharing anything online, always consider safety and privacy. Ensure you have permission to share any images or film of any participant. (See our Social Media and Photography Guidance resource for more details).

Remember that what is shared on the internet - even in a private forum - will remain 'out there'. If you use Zoom for your online gathering, ensure you use the 'waiting room' function to avoid 'gatecrashers' and find a secure way of sharing the link (such as via email).



Options for those who are completely offline

You may wish to use telephone conferencing to enable a group of people to dial in and speak on the same line. Free telephone conference services such as WhyPay enable numerous people to join the same call, meaning those at home can join over the phone.

Share the phone number, room number and pin code with participants and tell them when to dial in and then conduct your service or meeting over the phone. You could also put a phone on speaker/hands free that is dialled in to the number when you're running a live event in church that people at home could ring in to listen to.

Another option is to enable people to dial in by telephone to a Zoom meeting.



Organising your Virtual Christingle

This year we've created a collection of new resources specifically designed to make holding online celebrations easier – simply visit christingle.org/resources to order them.

All our other resources have also been adapted to enable Christingles to take place online, or in small numbers with social distancing, so this will make it easy for you to continue to share the light this year.

Bringing Christingles into homes

Will you supply oranges and sweets to homes or leave them at church for people to collect? Perhaps you'll ask people in advance to source items themselves? Whatever you decide, we've created bags that make keeping all your items together a little easier.

- Don't worry if you don't have the time or people to bring Christingles to people's homes. Our Talks and sermons resource includes a 'Scavenger Hunt' activity, enabling people to create a 'Christingle' without the items! This means anyone can join without the need to prepare.
- Our Christingle at home resource provides Christingle prayers and reflections for members of your congregation who don't have internet access. You can customise the resource, print it out and then make it available to your offline community.
- The Christingle arts, crafts and games resource also provides at-home reflections and fun activities for children. This can be used for adults and families without internet access, or in addition to your virtual service.

Music in Virtual services

■ While singing together and hearing each other sing isn't possible in virtual services, you may wish to play music as part of your service. You can visit the Christingle playlist for some inspiration. Please note, to stream music, your church must have a streaming license, such as that offered by CCLI. Promoting your Virtual Christingle

- Placing a Christingle colour-in prayer card in your window is a great way to share the light with your community – and colouring them in is such a fun activity for children! You can distribute the cards to your community in the bags, or send them online so people can print them out at home.
